



Cambridge University Eton Fives Club Safety Policy

STATEMENT

The Cambridge University Eton Fives Club (CUEFC) is strongly committed to encouraging our members to take part, whilst seeking to ensure that the health, well-being, and safety of each individual is managed effectively.

CLUB DUTIES

To support our Health and Safety policy statement we are committed to the following duties.

The President is responsible for general oversight of club safety management:

- Undertake regular, recorded risk assessment of the club premises.
- Create a safe environment by putting health and safety measures in place as identified by the assessment.
- Ensure that this policy is reviewed regularly.

The Men's and Ladies Captains are responsible for:

- Clear communication with club members on safety matters
 - Ensure that all members are given the appropriate level of training by regularly assessing individual ability dependent on age, maturity, and development.
 - Ensure that all members are aware of, understand and follow this policy
 - Ensure that club members are able to raise safety concerns
- Effective continuous management of safety arrangements
 - Hold responsibility for the safety of the club's members.
 - Review safety procedures, arrangements and information at committee meetings as required.
- Provide appropriate mitigation control measures for injuries
 - Provide access to adequate first aid facilities, telephone and qualified first aider at each of the Club's regular venues.
 - Report any injuries or accidents sustained during the playing of Eton fives at either of the Club's regular venues and investigate when necessary.

- Ensure that equipment is safe
 - Maintain equipment inventory.
 - Ensure that statutory equipment inspections are carried out when necessary.
 - Ensure that all equipment not fit for purpose is quarantined and repaired or disposed of as soon as possible.

MEMBER DUTIES

As a club member you have a duty to:

- Take reasonable care for your own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by what you do or not do.
- Co-operate with the club on health and safety issues.
- Correctly use all equipment provided by the club.
- Not interfere with or misuse anything provided for your health, safety, or welfare.

FIRST AID PROVISION WITHIN THE CLUB

There are two venues used regularly by CUEFC.

- The Cambridge University Sports Centre has first aid facilities, qualified first aider(s) and telephone available throughout opening hours
- Magdalene College has first aid facilities, qualified first aider(s) and telephone available 24/7 at the Porters Lodge

When playing fives at other venues, the responsibility for the provision of adequate first aid facilities, qualified first aiders, and telephone is held by the hosting team/ club/ organisation.
